

Standard Master's Degree in Montessori Pedagogy (0-6 group)

Introduction

Description of the Master's Degree

The Master's Degree in Montessori Pedagogy is for graduates of Education (in any speciality: Pre-School Education, Primary Education, Foreign Language, Physical Education, Special Needs Education, Hearing and Language, Music) and graduates of Pedagogy, and provides specific skills for pre-school professionals working with the 0-3 and 3-6 years old age groups, based on Montessori Pedagogy. Further to the official Master's Degree, students gain the certificate awarded by the *Association Montessori Internationale* (AMI), which qualifies them to work as teachers in Montessori classrooms.

Orientation

The Master's Degree has a professional orientation. However, if you wish to, once you have attained the Master's Degree, together with sufficient research skills credits, you may enter the research period of the Doctoral Programme in Educational Innovation and Intervention in Situations of Diversity, at the University of Vic.

Credits

60 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System)

Duration

The Master's Degree lasts two academic years. The first part takes place in the months of June, July and the first week of September 2013. Observation and teaching practice tale place from September 2013 to June 2014. The second part is in June and July 2014. The *viva voce* defence of the Master's Degree Final Project is to be held in June 2015

Places: 30

Mode of instruction

- Module 1: both on-campus and blended learning formats.
- Modules 2 and 3: on-campus.
- Module 4, Subjects 1 and 2 (Observation and teaching practice with the 0-3 and 3-6 age groups, respectively) are carried out in an AMI-certified Montessori classroom.

Language of instruction

Spanish and English. The entire Master's Degree is taught in each of the two languages.

You need sufficient English to consult bibliography. You also need sufficient skill in the main language of communication in the Montessori classroom where you do your practicum.

Fees

Fees per credit: € 142.67.

Approximate total fees: € 8,635.00. Half of this amount is to be paid in each year of the Master's programme.

Admissions

Admission requirements:

- Applicants need to meet UVic general admission requirements.
- Applicants should be Education graduates in any speciality (Pre-School Education, Primary Education, Foreign Language, Physical Education, Special Education, Hearing and Language, Music) or graduates in Pedagogy.

You may also be admitted with other university studies, provided that the admissions committee considers you have suitable prior knowledge. Such knowledge may derive from training or professional experience of at least 3 years. In this case you must submit documents to accredit the activity (only accredited activities will be taken into consideration):

- 1. Certificate of attainment in a foreign language, preferably English at Level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference.
- 2. Certificate of professional activities, together with a certificate from each employer concerned, with an indication of duties performed and levels taught.
- 3. Any other documentation that you consider appropriate, directly related to the Master's Degree.

Evaluation System

Subject areas will be evaluated as follows:

- Module 1 subject areas will be evaluated on the basis of participation in on-campus classes, tutorial sessions and your personal work plan.
- Module 2 and 3 subject areas will be assessed on the basis of participation in on-campus classes and tutorials, practical work undertaken in the Montessori Pre-School Classroom, and written work. In order to obtain the AMI certificate you must pass written and oral examinations graded by specialist AMI-certified teachers. Module 4 subject areas 1 and 2 (Observation and practice 0 3 years old and 3 6 years old, respectively) are assessed on the basis of the report of the university tutor, the report of the practicum centre supervisor and your own report on the experience of the Montessori classroom practicum.
- The Master's Degree Final Project is assessed by a panel, with an viva voce defence.



Competencies

- Offering children of 0 6 years old educational conditions that enhance overall development, both personal and social.
- Having a broad understanding of child developmental stages, and conditions and strategies to enhance development at each stage.
- Communicating and establishing a good relationship with children, their families and co-workers.
- Providing and organising a classroom with opportunities and stimuli for children to enhance their development.
- Knowing about and appropriately using strategies and materials of Montessori Pedagogy.
- Assessing objectives and procedures in early childhood education (0 6 years old).
- Innovating teaching practice on the basis of the results of your own research, reviewing and improving educational goals and practices.
- Carrying out reflective practice and research.
- Assuming leadership roles in professional practice.

Distinctive features of this programme

In two academic years you obtain AMI certification to teach in Montessori classrooms with children aged 0 - 3 years old and 3-6 years old. Most courses of this kind qualify you only to work with one of these two age groups.
